

- If you purchased a product from someone other than an authorized Brother reseller in the United States or if the product was used (including but not limited to floor models or refurbished product), prior to your purchase you are not the Original Purchaser and the product that you purchased is not covered by this warranty.

What is covered:

- This Product includes a Machine and Consumable and Accessory Items. Consumable and Accessory Items include but are not limited to print heads, toner, drums, ink cartridges, print cartridges, refill ribbons, therma PLUS paper and thermal paper.
- Except as otherwise provided herein, Brother warrants that the Machine and the accompanying Consumable and Accessory Items will be free from defects in materials and workmanship, when used under normal conditions.
- This warranty applies only to products purchased and used in the United States. For products purchased in, but used outside, the United States, this warranty covers only warranty service within the United States (and does not include shipping outside the United States).

What is the length of the Warranty Periods:

- Machines: one year from the original purchase date.
- Accompanying Consumable and Accessory Items: 90 days from the original purchase date or the rated life of consumable, whichever comes first.

What is NOT covered:

This warranty does not cover:

- 1 Physical damage to this Product;
- 2 Damage caused by improper installation, improper or abnormal use, misuse, neglect or accident (including but not limited to transporting this Product without the proper preparation and/or packaging);

Control panel overview



1 Dial Pad

Use these keys to dial telephone and fax numbers and as a keyboard for entering information into the machine.

The # key lets you temporarily switch the dialing mode during a telephone call from Pulse to Tone.

2 Fax keys

■ Fax Preview

Lets you preview incoming faxes on the LCD.

■ Redial/Pause

Redials any of the last 30 numbers you called. It also puts a pause in Quick-Dial numbers.

■ Hook

Press before dialing if you want to make sure a fax machine will answer, and then press **Black Start** or **Color Start**.

Also, press this key after picking up the handset of an external telephone during the F/T double/pseudo-ring.

3 Ink

Lets you clean the print head, check the print quality, and check the available ink volume.

4 Mode keys:


■ PhotoCapture

Lets you access PhotoCapture Center™ mode.

■ Copy
Lets you access Copy mode.

■ (Fax Lets you access Fax mode.

Lets you access Scan mode.



5 Menu keys:

■ Volume keys



In Fax mode, you can press these keys to adjust the ring volume.

■ ▲ Search/Speed Dial

Lets you look up numbers that are stored in the dialing memory. It also lets you dial stored numbers by pressing a two-digit number.

■ ◀ or ▶

Press to scroll backward or forward to a menu selection.

■ A or ▼

Press to scroll through the menus and options.

■ Menu

Lets you access the Menu to program your settings in the machine.

OK

Lets you store your settings in the machine.

■ Clear

Press to cancel the current setting.

6 Start keys:

■ **Color Start**

Lets you start sending faxes or making copies in full color. Also lets you start a scanning operation (in color or black & white, depending on the scanning setting in the ControlCenter2 software).

■ **Black Start**

Lets you start sending faxes or making copies in black & white. Also lets you start a scanning operation (in color or black, depending on the scanning setting in the ControlCenter2 software).

7 Stop/Exit

Stops an operation or exits from a menu.

8 On/Off

You can turn the machine on or off.

9 LCD (liquid crystal display)

Displays messages on the screen to help you set up and use your machine.

Also, you can adjust the angle of the LCD display by lifting it.

LCD display screen

The LCD shows the current machine status when the machine is idle.



1 Current Receive Mode

Lets you see the current receive mode.

- Fax (Fax only)
- F/T (Fax/Tel)
- TAD (External TAD)
- Mnl (Manual)

2 Fax in the machine's memory

Shows how many received faxes are in the memory.

3 Memory Status

Lets you see the available memory in the machine.

4 Wireless Status

A four level indicator shows the current wireless signal strength if you are using a wireless connection.



5 Ink indicator

Lets you see the available ink volume.







About fax machines

Custom features

Do you have Voice Mail on the phone line?

If you have Voice Mail on the phone line where you will install your new machine, there is a strong possibility that Voice Mail and the machine may conflict with each other while receiving incoming calls.

Why should there be problems?

Since both the machine and Voice Mail will pick up the call after the number of rings you have set, each of them has the ability to keep the other from receiving calls.

For example, if Voice Mail is set to answer after two rings and your machine is set to answer after four, Voice Mail will stop your machine from receiving faxes.

If you set Voice Mail and the Brother machine to answer after the same number of rings, there is no way of knowing which one will answer first. It is important to remember that neither Voice Mail nor the machine can pass the call back to the other after the call has been answered.

How can you avoid possible problems?

A very good way to avoid problems like the one mentioned, is to get a second phone number on your present phone line.

Many people with Voice Mail choose another service, which is called 'Distinctive Ring', and they are very satisfied with it. (See *Distinctive Ring* on page 39.)

Another way to avoid possible problems is to replace your Voice Mail with an answering machine. Your Brother machine is designed to work with an answering machine or TAD (telephone answering device).

(See Connecting an external TAD (telephone answering device) on page 43.)

Fax tones and handshake

When someone is sending a fax, the machine sends fax calling tones (CNG tones). These are quiet, intermittent beeps every 4 seconds. You will hear them after you dial and press **Black Start** or **Color Start** and they will continue for about 60 seconds after dialing. During that time, the sending machine must begin the 'handshake' or connection with the receiving machine.

Each time you use automatic procedures to send a fax, you are sending CNG tones over the phone line. You will soon learn to listen for these quiet beeps each time you answer a phone on your fax line, so you will know if you are receiving a fax message.

The receiving fax responds with fax receiving tones, which are loud, chirping sounds. A receiving fax chirps for about 40 seconds over the phone line, and the LCD shows Receiving.

If your machine is set to the Fax Only mode, it will answer every call automatically with fax receiving tones. If the other person hangs up, your machine will continue to send the 'chirps' for about 40 seconds, and the LCD continues to show Receiving. To cancel receiving, press **Stop/Exit**.

The fax 'handshake' is the time in which the sending machine's CNG tones and the receiving machine's 'chirps' overlap. This must be for at least 2 to 4 seconds, so both machines can understand how each is sending and receiving the fax. The handshake cannot begin until the call is answered, and the CNG tones only last for about 60 seconds after the number is dialed. So it is important for the receiving machine to answer the call in as few rings as possible.



When you have an external Telephone Answering Device (TAD) on your fax line, your TAD will decide the number of rings before the call is answered.

ECM (Error Correction Mode)

The Error Correction Mode (ECM) is a way for the machine to check a fax transmission while it is in progress. If the machine detects errors during fax transmission, it resends the pages of the fax that had an error. ECM transmissions are only possible between fax machines that both have this feature. If they do, you may send and receive fax messages that are continuously being checked by the machine.

Loading documents and paper

Loading documents

You can send a fax, make copies, and scan from the ADF (automatic document feeder) and from the scanner glass.

Using the ADF

The ADF can hold up to 10 pages and feeds each sheet individually. Use standard 20 lb (80 g/m²) paper and always fan the pages before putting them in the ADF.

Temperature: 68 to 86° F (20 to 30° C)

Humidity: 50% to 70%

Paper: 20 lb LTR (80 g/m² A4)

How to load documents




DO NOT pull on the document while it is feeding.

DO NOT use paper that is curled, wrinkled, folded, ripped, stapled, paper clipped, pasted or taped.

DO NOT use cardboard, newspaper or fabric.

- Make sure documents written with ink are completely dry.
- 1 Fan the pages well. Make sure you put the documents **face down, top edge first** in the ADF until you feel them touch the feed roller.
- Adjust the paper guides to fit the width of your documents.
- 3 Unfold the ADF Document Output Support Flap (1).



CAUTION

DO NOT leave thick documents on the scanner glass. If you do this, the ADF may jam.

Using the scanner glass

You can use the scanner glass to fax, copy or scan pages of a book or one page at a time.





If you are scanning a book or thick document, DO NOT slam the cover or press on it.

About paper

The print quality can be affected by the type of paper you use in the machine.

To get the best print quality for the settings you have chosen, always set the Paper Type to match the type of paper you load.

You can use plain paper, inkjet paper (coated paper), glossy paper, transparencies and envelopes.

We recommend testing various paper types before buying large quantities.

For best results, use the recommended paper.

- When you print on inkjet paper (coated paper), transparencies and glossy paper, be sure to choose the proper media in the 'Basic' tab of the printer driver or in the Paper Type setting of the menu (See Setting the Paper Type on page 21).
- When you print on Brother glossy paper, load the instruction sheet included with the glossy paper in the paper tray first, and then put the glossy paper on the instruction sheet.
- When you use transparencies or glossy paper, remove each sheet at once to prevent smudging or paper jams.
- Avoid touching the printed surface of the paper immediately after printing; the surface may not be completely dry and may stain your fingers.

Recommended paper

To get the best print quality, we suggest using Brother paper. (See table below.)

We recommend using '3M Transparency Film' when you print on transparencies.


Handling and using special paper

- Store paper in its original packaging, and keep it sealed. Keep the paper flat and away from moisture, direct sunlight and heat.
- The coated side of glossy paper is shiny. Avoid touching the shiny (coated) side. Load glossy paper with the shiny side facing down.
- Avoid touching either side of transparencies because they absorb water and perspiration easily, and this may cause decreased output quality. Transparencies designed for laser printers/copiers may stain your next document. Use only transparencies recommended for inkjet printing.

Minimum Improper Setup

DO NOT use the following kinds of paper:

· Damaged, curled, wrinkled, or irregularly shaped paper



- 1 0.08 in. (2 mm) or longer
- Extremely shiny or highly textured paper
- Paper already printed on by a printer
- Paper that cannot be arranged uniformly when stacked
- · Paper made with a short grain


Gently put the paper into the paper tray print side down and top edge first.

Make sure the paper side guides touch the sides of the paper.








Be careful that you do not push the paper in too far; it may lift at the back of the tray and cause feed problems.





Loading envelopes

- Use envelopes that weigh from 20 to 25 lb (75 to 95 g/m²).
- Some envelopes need margin settings to be set in the application. Make sure you do a test print first.



CAUTION

To prevent possible damage to the feeding mechanism, do not use the types of envelopes shown below.

DO NOT USE ENVELOPES:

- that are of a baggy construction
- that are embossed (have raised writing on them)
- that have clasps on them
- that are not sharply creased
- that are preprinted on the inside

How to load envelopes

1 Before loading, press the corners and sides of the envelopes to make them as flat as possible.




If the envelopes are 'double-feeding,' put one envelope in the paper tray at a time.








Put the envelopes into the paper tray with the address side down and the leading edge (top of the envelopes) in first. Slide the paper side guide to fit the width of the envelopes.



If you have problems when printing on envelopes, try the following suggestions:






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Sending a fax

Entering Fax mode

When the machine is idle the date and time appear on the LCD. When you want to send a fax, or change fax send or receive settings,

press the (Fax) key to illuminate it in green.



The LCD shows:



Press \triangle or ∇ to scroll through the **Fax** key options. Some functions are only available when sending black & white faxes.

When the option you want is highlighted, press **OK**.

Faxing from the ADF

- 2 Put the document face down in the ADF.

- · To cancel, press Stop/Exit.
- If the memory is full, the fax will be sent in real time.

Faxing from the scanner glass

You can use the scanner glass to fax pages of a book one at a time. The documents can be up to letter or A4 size.

You cannot send multiple pages for color faxes.



Since you can only scan one page at a time, it is easier to use the ADF if you are sending a multiple page document.

- 1 Press ((Fax).
- 2 Load your document face down on the scanner glass.
- 3 Enter the fax number using the dial pad, Speed-Dial or Search.
- 4 Press Black Start or Color Start.
 - If you press Black Start, the machine starts scanning the first page. Go to step 6.
 - If you press Color Start, the machine starts sending the document.
- 5 Do one of the following:
 - To send a single page, press 2 to choose No (or press Black Start again).
 - The machine starts sending the document.
 - To send more than one page, press
 1 to choose Yes and go to step 6.
- 6 Put the next page on the scanner glass. Press **OK**.

The machine starts scanning the page. (Repeat steps **⑤** and **⑥** for each additional page.)



If the memory is full and you are faxing a single page, it will be sent in real time.

Faxing A4 size documents from the scanner glass

When documents are A4 size, you need to set Scan Size to A4. If you do not, the bottom portion of the faxes will be missing.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Scan Size. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose A4 (or Letter).
 Press OK.



You can save the setting you use most often by setting it as default. (See page 31.)

Canceling a fax in progress

If you want to cancel a fax while the machine is scanning, dialing or sending, press **Stop/Exit**.

Color fax transmission

Your machine can send a color fax to machines that support this feature.

However, color faxes cannot be stored in the memory. When you send a color fax, the machine will send it in real time (even if Real Time TX is set to Off).

Broadcasting (Black & White only)

Broadcasting is when the same fax message is automatically sent to more than one fax number. You can include Groups, Speed-Dial numbers and up to 50 manually dialed numbers in the same broadcast.

After the broadcast is finished, a Broadcast Report will be printed.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- 2 Load your document.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Broadcasting.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Add Number. Press OK.
- Enter a number using Speed-Dial, a Group, or the dial pad. Press OK.
- 6 After you have entered all the fax numbers by repeating steps ④ and ⑤, press ▲ or ▼ to choose Complete. Press OK.
- Press Black Start.



- If you did not use up any of the numbers for Groups, access codes or credit card numbers, you can 'broadcast' faxes to as many as 210 different numbers.
- The available memory will vary depending on the types of jobs in the memory and the number of locations used for broadcasting. If you broadcast to the maximum numbers available, you will not be able to use dual access and delayed fax.

- Enter the long dialing sequence numbers as you would normally, but remember that each and Speed-Dial number counts as one number, so the number of locations you can store becomes limited. (See Access codes and credit card numbers on page 54.)
- If the memory is full, press Stop/Exit to stop the job. If more than one page has been scanned, press Black Start to send the portion that is in the memory.

To stop a Broadcast in progress

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Remaining Jobs.
 Press OK.
 The LCD will show the fax number being dialed and the Broadcast job number.

Sending faxes using multiple settings

When you send a fax you can choose any combination of these settings: resolution, contrast, overseas mode, delayed fax timer, polling transmission and real time transmission.

1 Press (Fax). The LCD shows:



- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose any settings you want to change. Press OK.
- 3 After each setting is accepted, you can continue to change more settings.



- Most settings are temporary and the machine returns to its default settings after you send a fax.
- You can save some of the settings you use most often by setting them as default. These settings will stay until you change them again. (See Setting your changes as new default on page 31.)

Contrast

If your document is very light or very dark, you may want to change the contrast.

Use Light to send a light document.

Use Dark to send a dark document.

- 1 Press (Fax)
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Contrast. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Auto, Light or Dark.
 Press OK.



Even if you choose Light or Dark, the machine will send the fax using the Auto setting in any of the following conditions:

- When you send a color fax.
- When you choose Photo as the Fax Resolution.

Fax Resolution

The quality of a fax can be improved by changing the fax resolution.

- 1 Press 🥝 (Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax Resolution. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the resolution you want. Press OK.



You can choose four different resolution settings for black & white faxes and two for color.

Black & White	
Standard	Suitable for most typed documents.
Fine	Good for small print and transmits a little slower than Standard resolution.
S.Fine	Good for small print or artwork and transmits slower than Fine resolution.
Photo	Use when the document has varying shades of gray or is a photograph. This has the slowest transmission.

Color	
Standard	Suitable for most typed documents.
Fine	Use when the document is a photograph. The transmission time is slower than Standard resolution.

If you choose S.Fine or Photo and then use the Color Start key to send a fax, the machine will send the fax using the Fine setting.

Dual access (Black & White only)

You can dial a number and start scanning the fax into memory—even when the machine is sending from memory, receiving faxes or printing PC data. The LCD shows the new job number and available memory.

To send a color fax, the machine will send the document in real time (even if Real Time TX is Off).

The number of pages you can scan into the memory will vary depending on the data that is printed on them.



If the Out of Memory message appears while scanning documents, press Stop/Exit to cancel or Black Start to send the scanned pages.

Real Time Transmission

When you are sending a fax, the machine will scan the document into the memory before sending them. Then, as soon as the phone line is free, the machine will start dialing and sending.

If the memory is full, the machine will send the document in real time (even if Real Time TX is set to Off).

Sometimes, you may want to send an important document immediately, without waiting for memory transmission. You can turn on Real Time TX.

To send a document at once without waiting for memory transmission, set

Real Time TX to On.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Real Time TX. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose on. Press **OK**.



- In real time transmission, the automatic redial feature does not work when using the scanner glass.
- If you are sending a color fax, the machine will send it in real time (even if Real Time TX is set to Off).

Overseas Mode

If you are having difficulty sending a fax overseas due to possible interference on the phone line, we recommend that you turn on the Overseas mode. After you send a fax using this feature, the feature will turn itself off.

- 1 Press 🧒 (Fax).
- 2 Load your document.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Overseas Mode.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose on (or off).
 Press OK

Delayed Fax (Black & White only)

During the day you can store up to 50 faxes in the memory to be sent within 24-hours. These faxes will be sent at the time of day you enter in step **5**.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- 2 Load your document.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Delayed Fax. Press OK
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose on. Press OK.
- 5 Enter the time you want the fax to be sent (in 24-hour format).
 (For example, enter 19:45 for 7:45 PM.)
 Press **OK**.



The number of pages you can scan into the memory depends on the amount of data that is printed on each page.

Delayed Batch Transmission (Black & White only)

Before sending the delayed faxes, your machine will help you economize by sorting all the faxes in the memory by destination and scheduled time. All delayed faxes that are scheduled to be sent at the same time to the same fax number will be sent as one fax to save transmission time.

- 1 Press ((Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Batch TX. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose on. Press OK.
- 4 Press Stop/Exit.

Setting your changes as new default

You can save the fax settings for Fax Resolution, Contrast, Real Time TX and Scan Size you use most often by setting them the default setting. These settings will stay until you change them again.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose your new setting. Press OK. Repeat this step for each setting you want to change.
- 3 After changing the last setting, press ▲ or ▼ to choose Set New Default. Press OK.
- 4 Press 1 to choose Yes.
- 5 Press Stop/Exit.

Restoring all the settings to factory settings

You can restore all the settings you have changed to the factory settings. These settings will stay until you change them again.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Factory Reset. Press OK.
- 3 Press 1 to choose Yes.
- 4 Press Stop/Exit.

Checking job status or canceling a scheduled job

You can check which jobs are still waiting in the memory to be sent and cancel a job. (If there are no jobs, the LCD shows

No Jobs Waiting.)

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose

 Remaining Jobs.

 Press OK.

 Any waiting jobs appear on the LCD.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll through the jobs and choose the job you want to cancel. Press OK.
- Do one of the following:
 - To cancel, press 1 to choose Yes.
 If you want to cancel another job go to step 4.
 - To exit without canceling, press 2 to choose No.
- 6 Press Stop/Exit.

Sending a fax manually

Manual transmission lets you hear the dialing, ringing and fax-receiving tones while sending a fax.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- 2 Load your document.
- 3 Pick up the handset of an external phone or press **Hook** and listen for a dial tone.
- 4 Dial the fax number you want to call. If you pressed **Hook**, dial using the machine's dial pad. If you picked up the external handset, dial on the external phone.
- 5 When you hear the fax tone, press Black Start or Color Start.
- 6 If you picked up the handset of an external phone replace it.

Sending a fax at the end of a conversation

At the end of a conversation you can send a fax to the other party before you both hang up.

- 1 Ask the other party to wait for fax tones (beeps) and then to press the Start or Send key before hanging up.
- Press (Fax).
- 3 Load your document.
- Press Black Start or Color Start.
- 5 Replace the handset of an external phone.

Out of Memory message

If you get an Out of Memory message while scanning the first page of a fax, press **Stop/Exit** to cancel the fax.

If you get an Out of Memory message while scanning a subsequent page, you will have the option to press **Black Start** to send the pages scanned so far, or to press **Stop/Exit** to cancel the operation.



If you get an Out of Memory message while faxing and you do not want to delete your stored faxes to clear the memory, you can send the fax in real time. (See Real Time Transmission on page 30.)

Receiving a Fax

Basic Receiving Operations

Choosing the Receive Mode

There are four different receive modes for your machine. You can choose the mode that best suits your needs.

LCD	How it works	When to use it
Fax Only (automatic receive)	The machine automatically answers every call as a fax.	For dedicated fax lines.
Fax/Tel (fax and telephone) (with an external or extension telephone only)	The machine controls the line and automatically answers every call. If the call is a fax it will receive the fax. If the call is not a fax it will ring (pseudo/double ring) for you to pick up the call.	Use this mode if you expect to receive lots of fax messages and few telephone calls. You cannot use an answering machine on the same line, even if it is on a separate wall jack on the same line. You cannot use the telephone company's Voice Mail in this mode.
External TAD (with an external answering device only)	The external answering device (TAD) automatically answers every call. Voice messages are stored on the external TAD. If it is a fax call, the machine receives the fax.	Use this mode if you want to use an answering machine connected to your machine. The External TAD setting works only with an external answering machine. Ring Delay does not work in this setting.
Manual (manual receive) (with an external or extension telephone only)	You control the phone line and must answer every call yourself.	Use this mode if you do not receive many fax messages, use Distinctive Ring, or if you are using a computer on the same line. If you answer and hear fax tones, wait until the machine takes over the call, then hang up. (See Easy Receive on page 36.)

Choosing or changing your Receive Mode

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Initial Setup. Press OK.

- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose

 Receive Mode.

 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax Only, Fax/Tel, External TAD or Manual. Press OK.
- 5 Press Stop/Exit.

Setting the Ring Delay

The Ring Delay sets the number of times the machine rings before it answers in Fax Only or Fax/Tel mode. If you have external or extension phones on the same line as the machine or subscribe to the telephone company's Distinctive Ring service, keep the ring delay setting of 4.

(See Operation from extension telephones on page 38 and Easy Receive on page 36.)

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Setup Receive.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Ring Delay. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose how many times the line rings before the machine answers (0-4).
 Press OK.
 If you choose 0, the line will not ring at all.
- 6 Press Stop/Exit.

Setting the F/T Ring Time (Fax/Tel mode only)

If you set the Receive Mode to Fax/Tel, you need to decide how long the machine will signal you with its special pseudo/double-ring when you have a *voice* call. (If it's a fax call, the machine receives the fax.)

This pseudo/double-ring happens after the initial ringing from the phone company. Only the machine rings and no other phones on the same line will ring with the special pseudo/double-ring. However, you can still answer the call on any telephone.

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Setup Receive. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose F/T Ring Time. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose how long the machine will ring to alert you that you have a voice call (20, 30, 40 or 70 seconds).

 Press OK.
- 6 Press Stop/Exit.



Even if the caller hangs up during the pseudo/double-ringing, the machine will continue to ring for the set time.

Easy Receive

If Easy Receive is On:

The machine receives fax calls automatically, even if you lift the handset of an extension or external phone. When you see Receiving on the LCD or when you hear 'chirps' through the handset of an extension phone connected to another telephone wall jack, just replace the handset and your machine will do the rest.

If Easy Receive is Off:

You have to lift the handset of an external phone, and then press **Black Start** or **Color Start** on the machine.

If you are not at your machine, press \times 5 1 on the extension phone. (See *Operation from extension telephones* on page 38.)



- If this feature is set to On, but your machine does not connect a fax call when you lift an extension or external phone handset, press the fax receive code * 51.
- If you send faxes from a computer on the same phone line and the machine intercepts them, set Easy Receive to Off.
- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax.
 Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Setup Receive. Press OK.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Easy Receive. Press OK.
- 5 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose on (or off). Press OK.
- 6 Press Stop/Exit.

Printing a reduced incoming fax (Auto Reduction)

The setting will automatically reduce an incoming fax to fit on one page of Letter, Legal or A4 size paper. The machine works out the reduction ratio by using the page size of the document and your paper size setting (See Setting the Paper Size on page 21).

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Setup Receive. Press OK.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Auto Reduction.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose on (or off). Press OK.
- 6 Press Stop/Exit.



- Turn on this setting if you receive faxes that are split onto two pages. However, if the document is too long the machine may still print on two pages.
- If left and right margins are cut off, turn on this setting.
- When this feature is set to On, the Letter or Legal faxes people send to you may appear slightly shrunk even though your machine prints them on Letter or Legal paper. This is because the machine has to print the Station ID of the sending machine at the top of the page.

Receiving a fax at the end of a conversation

At the end of a conversation on an external phone you can ask the other party to fax you information before you both hang up.

- 1 Ask the other party to put the document in their machine and to press the Start or Send key.
- When you hear the other machine's CNG tones (beeps), press **Black Start** or **Color Start**.
- 3 Press 2 to receive a fax.
- 4 Replace the handset of the external phone.

Printing a fax from the memory

If you have chosen paging or fax storage, you can still print a fax from the memory when you are at your machine. (See *Turning off Advanced Fax Operation* on page 59.)

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Advanced Fax Operation.
 Press OK.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Print Fax. Press OK.
- Press Black Start.

Phone Services and External devices

Voice operations

Voice calls can be made either with an extension or external telephone.

Tone or pulse

If you are using an external phone and have a pulse dialing service, but need to send tone signals (for example, for telephone banking), follow the instructions below. If you have Touch Tone service, you will not need this feature to send tone signals.



Lift the handset of the external phone.



Press # on the control panel of your machine. Any digits dialed after this will send tone signals.

When you hang up, the machine will return to the pulse dialing service.

Operation from extension telephones

If you answer a fax call on an extension or an external telephone connected to the EXT. jack of the machine, you can make your machine take the call by using the Fax Receive Code. When you press the Fax Receive Code \pm 5 1. the machine starts to receive the fax.

If the machine answers a voice call and pseudo/double-rings for you to take over, use the Telephone Answer Code # 5 1 to take the call at an extension phone. (See Setting the F/T Ring Time (Fax/Tel mode only) on page 35.)

If you answer a call and no one is on the line:

You should assume that you're receiving a manual fax.

Press * 5 1 and wait for the chirp or until the LCD shows Receiving, and then hang up.



M Note

You can also use the Easy Receive feature to make your machine automatically take the call. (See Easy Receive on page 36.)

Fax/Tel mode when the power key is on

When the machine is in Fax/Tel mode, it will use the F/T Ring Time (pseudo/doubleringing) to alert you to pick up a voice call.

If you are at an extension phone, you'll need to lift the handset during the F/T Ring Time and then press # 5 1 between the pseudo/double rings. If no one is on the line, or if someone wants to send you a fax, send the call back to the machine by pressing X 51.

Fax/Tel mode when the power key is off

You can change the default setting of the On/Off key to Fax Receive: On so that you can receive faxes when the power key is off. (See On/Off setting on page 20.) Fax/Tel mode will work in the following ways.

Fax/Tel mode does not work when the power key is off. The machine will not answer telephone or fax calls and will keep ringing. If you are at an external or extension phone, lift the handset and talk. If you hear fax tones, hold the handset until Easy Receive activates your machine. If the other party says they want to send you a fax, activate the machine by pressing X 51.

Phone line services

Your machine supports the Caller ID and Distinctive Ring subscriber telephone services that some telephone companies offer.



- · If you have Voice Mail, Call Waiting, Call Waiting/Caller ID, RingMaster, an answering service, an alarm system or other custom features on your telephone line, it may affect the way your machine works. (See Custom features on page 9 and If you are having difficulty with your machine on page 106.)
- If you have Voice Mail on your phone line, read the following carefully.

Distinctive Ring

Brother uses the term 'Distinctive Ring' but different telephone companies have other names for this service such as SmartRing, RingMaster, Teen-Ring, Indent-a-Call or Indent-a-Ring.

What does your telephone company's 'Distinctive Ring' do?

Your telephone company's Distinctive Ring service allows you to have more than one number on the same phone line. If you need more than one phone number, it is cheaper than paying for an extra line. Each phone number has its own distinctive ring pattern, so you will know which phone number is ringing. This is one way you can have a separate phone number for your machine.



Please call your telephone company for availability and rates.

What does Brother's 'Distinctive Ring' do?

The Brother machine has a Distinctive Ring feature that allows you to use your machine to take full advantage of the telephone company's Distinctive Ring service. The new phone number on your line can just receive faxes.



You must pay for your telephone company's Distinctive Ring service before you program the machine to work with it.

Do you have Voice Mail?

If you have Voice Mail on the phone line that you will install your new machine on, there is a strong possibility that Voice Mail and the machine will conflict with each other while receiving incoming calls. However, the Distinctive Ring feature allows you to use more than one number on your line, so both Voice Mail and the machine can work together without any problems. If each one has a separate phone number, neither will interfere with the other's operations.

If you decide to get the Distinctive Ring service from the telephone company, you will need to follow the directions on next page to 'register' the new Distinctive Ring pattern they give you. This is so your machine can recognize its incoming calls.



You can change or cancel the Distinctive Ring pattern at any time. You can switch it off temporarily, and turn it back on later. When you get a new fax number, make sure you reset this feature.

Before you choose the ring pattern to register

You can only register one Distinctive Ring pattern with the machine. Some ring patterns cannot be registered. The ring patterns below are supported by your Brother machine. Register the one your telephone company gives you.

Ring Pattern	Rings	
1	long-long	4
2	short-long-short	
3	short-short-long	5
4	very long (normal pattern)	J



If the ring pattern you received is not on this chart, please call your telephone company and ask for one that is shown.

- The machine will only answer calls to its registered number.
- The first two rings are silent on the machine. This is because the fax must 'listen' to the ring pattern (to compare it to the pattern that was 'registered'). (Other telephones on the same line will ring.)
- If you program the machine properly, it will recognize the registered ring pattern of the 'fax number' within 2 ring patterns and then answer with a fax tone. When the 'voice number' is called, the machine will not answer.

Registering the Distinctive Ring pattern

After you have set the Distinctive Ring feature to on, the receive mode is set to Manual automatically. You cannot change the receive mode to another mode while the Distinctive Ring is set to on.

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Miscellaneous. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Distinctive. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Set. Press OK.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the stored ring pattern you want to use. Press OK. (You hear each pattern as you scroll through the four patterns. Make sure you choose the pattern that the telephone company gave you.)
- 7 Press Stop/Exit.
 Distinctive Ring is now set to on.

Turning off Distinctive Ring

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Miscellaneous. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Distinctive. Press OK.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose off. Press OK.



6 Press Stop/Exit.



If you turn off Distinctive Ring, the machine will stay in Manual receive mode. You will need to set the Receive Mode again. (See Choosing the Receive Mode on page 34.)

Caller ID

The Caller ID feature lets you use the Caller ID subscriber service offered by many local telephone companies. Call your telephone company for details. This service shows the telephone number, or name if it is available, of your caller as the line rings.

You can use a number in the Caller ID History to send a fax, add it to Speed-Dial, or delete it from the history. (See Caller ID history on page 50.)

After a few rings, the LCD shows the telephone number of your caller (and name, if available). Once you pick up the external phone's handset, the Caller ID information disappears from the LCD, but the call information stays stored in the Caller ID memory.

- You can see the first 15 characters of the number (or name).
- The Out of Area message means the call originated outside your Caller ID service area.
- The Private Call message means the caller has intentionally blocked transmission of information.

You can print a list of the Caller ID information received by your machine. (See Printing Caller ID List on page 42.)



Caller ID service varies with different carriers. Call your local telephone company to find out about the kind of service available in your area.

Viewing Caller ID List

Caller ID memory stores information for up to thirty calls. When the thirty-first call comes in, information about the first call is erased. You can scroll through Caller ID information to review those calls made to your machine.

- 1 Press Menu.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press **OK**.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Miscellaneous.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Caller ID. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Display#. Press OK. The Caller ID of the last call will appear on the display. If no ID is stored, the beeper will sound and No Caller ID will appear on the display.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll through the Caller ID memory to choose the Caller ID you want to view, and then press **OK**. The LCD shows the caller's number and the date and time of the call.
- 7 Do one of the following:
 - To return to the Caller ID listing, press ◀.
 - To finish viewing, press **Stop/Exit**.



You can also view the Caller ID list by pressing (Fax). (See Caller ID history on page 50.)

Printing Caller ID List


- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Miscellaneous.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Caller ID. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Print Report.
 Press OK.
 If no ID is stored, the beeper will sound
 and No Caller ID will appear on the
 LCD.
- 6 Press Black Start or Color Start.
- 7 After printing has finished, press Stop/Exit.

Connecting an external device to your machine

Connecting an external or extension telephone

You can connect a separate telephone (or telephone answering device) directly to your machine as shown in the diagram below.

Connect the telephone line cord to the jack labeled EXT.



- 1 Extension telephone
- 2 External telephone

When you are using an external phone, the LCD shows Telephone.

Connecting an external TAD (telephone answering device)

You may choose to connect an external answering device. However, when you have an **external** TAD on the same telephone line as the machine, the TAD answers all calls and the machine 'listens' for fax calling (CNG) tones. If it hears them, the machine takes over the call and receives the fax. If it does not hear CNG tones, the machine lets the TAD continue playing your outgoing message so your caller can leave you a voice message.

The TAD must answer within four rings (the recommended setting is two rings). The machine cannot hear CNG tones until the TAD has answered the call, and with four rings there are only 8 to 10 seconds of CNG tones left for the fax 'handshake'. Make sure you carefully follow the instructions in this guide for recording your outgoing message. We do not recommend using the toll saver feature on your external answering machine if it exceeds five rings.



- If you do not receive all your faxes, reduce the Ring Delay setting on your external TAD.
- If You Subscribe to your Telephone company's Distinctive Ring Service:

You may connect an external TAD to a separate wall jack only if you subscribe to your telephone company's Distinctive Ring service, have registered the distinctive ring pattern on your machine, and use that number as a fax number. The recommended setting is at least four rings on the external TAD when you have the telephone company's Distinctive Ring Service. You cannot use the Toll Saver setting.


 If You Do Not Subscribe to Distinctive Ring Service:

You must plug your TAD into the EXT. jack of your machine. If your TAD is plugged into a wall jack, both your machine and the TAD will try to control the phone line. (See illustration below.)

Improper Setup

Unless you are using Distinctive Ring, the TAD must be connected to the EXT jack of the machine.



1 TAD

When the TAD answers a call, the LCD shows Telephone.

Connections

The external TAD must be plugged into the jack labeled EXT. Your machine cannot work properly if you plug the TAD into a wall jack (unless you are using Distinctive Ring).

- 1 Plug the telephone line cord from the telephone wall jack into the jack labeled LINE.
- Plug the telephone line cord from the external TAD into the jack labeled EXT. (Make sure this cord is connected to the TAD at the TAD's telephone line jack, and not its handset jack.)
- 3 Set your external TAD to four rings or less. (The machine's Ring Delay setting does not apply.)
- Record the outgoing message on your external TAD.
- 5 Set the TAD to answer calls.

6 Set the Receive Mode to
External TAD. (See Choosing the Receive Mode on page 34.)

Recording outgoing message (OGM) on an external TAD

Timing is important in recording this message. The message sets up the ways to handle both manual and automatic fax reception.

- 1 Record 5 seconds of silence at the beginning of your message. (This allows your machine time to listen for the fax CNG tones of automatic transmissions before they stop.)
- 2 Limit your speaking to 20 seconds.
- 3 End your 20-second message by giving your Fax Receive Code for people sending manual faxes. For example: 'After the beep, leave a message or send a fax by pressing **X** 5 1 and Start.'



We recommend beginning your OGM with an initial 5-second silence because the machine cannot hear fax tones over a resonant or loud voice. You may try omitting this pause, but if your machine has trouble receiving, then you must rerecord the OGM to include it.

Special line considerations

Roll over phone lines

A roll over phone system is a group of two or more separate telephone lines that pass incoming calls to each other if they are busy. The calls are usually passed down or 'rolled over' to the next available phone line in a preset order.

Your machine can work in a roll over system as long as it is the last number in the sequence, so the call cannot roll away. Do not put the machine on any of the other numbers; when the other lines are busy and a second fax call is received, the fax call will be sent to a line that does not have a fax machine. Your machine will work best on a dedicated line.

Two-line phone system


A two-line phone system is nothing more than two separate phone numbers on the same wall outlet. The two phone numbers can be on separate jacks (RJ11) or mixed into one jack (RJ14). Your machine must be plugged into an RJ11 jack. RJ11 and RJ14 jacks may be equal in size and appearance and both may contain four wires (black, red, green, yellow). To test the type of jack, plug in a two-line phone and see if it can access both lines. If it can, you must separate the line for your machine. (See page 36.)

Converting telephone wall outlets

There are three ways to convert to an RJ11 jack. The first two ways may require help from the telephone company. You can change the wall outlets from one RJ14 jack to two RJ11 jacks. Or you can have an RJ11 wall outlet installed and slave or jump one of the phone numbers to it.

The third way is the easiest: Buy a triplex adapter. You can plug a triplex adapter into an RJ14 outlet. It separates the wires into two separate RJ11 jacks (Line 1, Line 2) and a third RJ14 jack (Lines 1 and 2). If your machine is on Line 1, plug the machine into L1 of the triplex adapter. If your machine is on Line 2, plug it into L2 of the triple adapter.

Triplex Adapter




Installing machine, external two-line TAD and two-line telephone

When you are installing an external two-line telephone answering device (TAD) and a two-line telephone, your machine must be isolated on one line at both the wall jack and at the TAD. The most common connection is to put the machine on Line 2, which is explained in the following steps. The back of the two-line TAD must have two telephone jacks: one labeled L1 or L1/L2, and the other labeled L2. You will need at least three telephone line cords, the one that came with your machine and two for your external two-line TAD. You will need a fourth line cord if you add a two-line telephone.

- 1 Put the two-line TAD and the two-line telephone next to your machine.
- Plug one end of the telephone line cord for your machine into the L2 jack of the triplex adapter. Plug the other end into the LINE jack on the back of the machine.
- 3 Plug one end of the first telephone line cord for your TAD into the L1 jack of the triplex adapter. Plug the other end into the L1 or L1/L2 jack of the two-line TAD.

4 Plug one end of the second telephone line cord for your TAD into the L2 jack of the two-line TAD. Plug the other end into the EXT. jack on the left side of the machine.

You can keep two-line telephones on other wall outlets as always. There are two ways to add a two-line telephone to the machine's wall outlet. You can plug the telephone line cord from the two-line telephone into the L1+L2 jack of the triplex adapter. Or you can plug the two-line telephone into the TEL jack of the two-line TAD.

Multi-line connections (PBX)

Most offices use a central telephone system. While it is often relatively simple to connect the machine to a key system or a PBX (Private Branch Exchange), we suggest that you contact the company that installed your telephone system and ask them to connect the machine for you. It is advisable to have a separate line for the machine.

If the machine is to be connected to a multiline system, ask your installer to connect the unit to the last line on the system. This prevents the unit from being activated each time a telephone call is received.

If you are installing the machine to work with a PBX

- 1 It is not guaranteed that the unit will work properly under all circumstances with a PBX. Report any cases of problems first to the company that handles your PBX.
- If all incoming calls will be answered by a switchboard operator, we recommend setting the Receive Mode to Manual. All incoming calls should at first be regarded as telephone calls.

Custom features on your phone line

If you have Voice Mail, Call Waiting, Call Waiting/Caller ID, RingMaster, an answering service, an alarm system or any other custom feature on one phone line it may create a problem with the operation of your machine. (See *Custom features* on page 9 and *If you are having difficulty with your machine* on page 106.)

Using a cordless phone

If your cordless telephone is connected to the EXT. jack of the machine and you typically carry the cordless handset elsewhere, it is easier to answer calls during the Ring Delay.

If you let the machine answer first, you will have to go to the machine so you can press **Hook** to send the call to the cordless handset.

Changing the remote codes

The preset Fax Receive Code is \pm 5 1. The preset Telephone Answer Code is \pm 5 1. If you want to, you can replace them with your own codes.

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax.
 Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Setup Receive. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose

 Remote Codes.

 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose on (or off).
 Press OK.
- 6 Enter the new Fax Receive Code.
 Press **OK**.
- 7 Enter the new Telephone Answer Code. Press **OK**.
- 8 Press Stop/Exit.



- If you are always disconnected when accessing your external TAD remotely, try changing the Fax Receive Code and Telephone Answer Code to another threedigit code (such as # # # and 9 9 9).
- Remote Codes might not work with some telephone systems.

Quick-Dial Numbers and Dialing Options

Dialing Options

You can dial in any of the following ways.

Manual dialing

Press all of the digits of the fax number.



Speed-Dialing

Press Search/Speed Dial.

Search/Speed Dial



You can also choose Speed-Dial by pressing ((Fax).

If the LCD shows Not Registered when you enter a Speed-Dial number, a number has not been stored at this location.

Search by Alphabetical Order

You can search for names you have stored in the Speed-Dial memory.

- Press Search/Speed Dial. You can also choose Speed-Dial by pressing (Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Alphabetical Order. Press OK.



- Press *\foat to make the LCD font size larger.
- Press # to make the LCD font size smaller.
- Use the dial pad to enter the first letter of the name, and then press ▲ or ▼ to choose the name and number you want to call.

Press OK.

Search by Numerical Order

You can use the Speed-Dial location to search for names and numbers you have stored in Speed-Dial memories.

- 1 Press Search/Speed Dial. You can also choose Speed-Dial by pressing (Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Numerical Order. Press OK.



- Press X to make the LCD font size larger.
- Press # to make the LCD font size smaller.
- Senter the first digit (1 to 8) of a 2-digit Speed-Dial location, and then press ▲ or ▼ to choose the name and number you want to call. (For example, enter 3 to start your search at Speed-Dial location 30.) Press OK.

Fax Redial

If you are sending a fax manually and the line is busy, press **Redial/Pause**, and then press **Black Start** or **Color Start** to try again. If you want to make a second call to a number you recently dialed, you can press **Redial/Pause** and choose one of the last 30 numbers from the Outgoing Call List.

Redial/Pause only works if you dialed from the control panel. *If you are sending a fax automatically* and the line is busy, the machine will automatically redial once after five minutes.

- 1 Press Redial/Pause.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the number you want to redial.
 Press OK.

- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Send a fax. Press OK.
- 4 Press Black Start or Color Start.



In Real Time Transmission the automatic redial feature does not work when using the scanner glass.

Outgoing Call

The last 30 numbers you faxed to will be stored in the outgoing call history. You can choose one of these numbers to send a fax, add it to Speed-Dial, or delete it from the history.

 by pressing (Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the number you want to call.
 Press OK.
- 3 Do one of the following:
 - To send a fax, press or vo choose Send a fax.

Caller ID history

This feature requires the Caller ID subscriber service offered by many local telephone companies. (See Caller ID on page 41.)

The last 30 numbers of faxes you received will be stored in the Caller ID history. You can choose one of these numbers to send a fax, add it to Speed-Dial, or delete it from the history.

- 1 Press 🦾 (Fax).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Caller ID hist.. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the number you want to call. Press OK.
- Do one of the following:
 - To send a fax, press or to choose Send a fax. Press OK.
 - If you want to store the number, press ▲ or ▼ to choose Add to Speed-Dial. Press OK.
 - (See Storing Speed-Dial numbers from Outgoing Calls on page 51.) ■ Press A or ▼ to choose Delete.
 - Press OK. Then, confirm the Delete by pressing 1.



You can print the Caller ID list. (See Printing Caller ID List on page 42.)

Pause

Press Redial/Pause to put a 3.5-second pause between numbers. If you are dialing overseas, you can press Redial/Pause as many times as needed to increase the length of the pause.

Storing numbers for easy dialing

You can set up your machine to do the following types of easy dialing: Speed-Dial and Groups for broadcasting faxes. When you dial a Quick-Dial number, the LCD shows the name, if you stored it, or the number.



If you lose electrical power, the Quick-Dial numbers that are in the memory will not be lost.

Storing Speed-Dial numbers

You can store up to 80 2-digit Speed-Dial locations with a name, and each name can have two numbers. When you dial you will only have to press a few keys (For example: Search/Speed Dial, the two-digit number, and Black Start or Color Start).

If you have the Caller ID subscriber service from your telephone company you can also store Speed-Dial numbers from incoming calls in the Caller ID History. (See *Caller ID* on page 41.)

- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the number you want to store.
 Press OK.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Add to Speed-Dial. Press OK.
- 5 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the 2-digit Speed-Dial location you want to store the number in.

 Press **OK**.
- 6 Do one of the following:
 - Enter the name (up to 15 characters) using the dial pad.
 Press **OK**.

(To help you enter letters, see *Entering Text* on page 133.)

To store the number without a name, press **OK**.

Setting up Groups for Broadcasting

Groups, which can be stored on a Speed-Dial location, allow you to send the same fax message to many fax numbers by pressing only **Search/Speed Dial**, the two-digit location and **Black Start**. First, you'll need to store each fax number in a Speed-Dial location. Then you can include them as numbers in the Group. Each Group uses up a Speed-Dial location. You can have up to six Groups, or you can assign up to 79 numbers to one large Group.

(See Storing Speed-Dial numbers on page 50 and Broadcasting (Black & White only) on page 28.)

- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose

Access codes and credit card numbers

Sometimes you may want to choose from several long distance carriers when you make a call. Rates may vary depending on the time and destination. To take advantage of low rates, you can store the access codes or long-distance carriers and credit card numbers as Speed-Dial numbers. You can store these long dialing sequences by dividing them and setting them up as separate Speed-Dial numbers in any combination. You can even include manual dialing using the dial pad. (See Storing Speed-Dial numbers on page 50.)

For example, you have stored '555' on Speed-Dial: 03 and '7000' on Speed-Dial: 02.

- 1 Press Search/Speed Dial.
- 2 Enter **03**.



If you stored 2 numbers in one Speed-Dial location, you will be asked which number you want to send to.

- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Speed-Dial. Press OK.
- 4 Enter **02**.
- 5 Press Black Start or Color Start. You will dial '555-7000'.

To temporarily change a number, you can substitute part of the number with manual dialing using the dial pad. For example, to change the number to 555-7001 you could press **Search/Speed Dial**, **03** and then press **7001** using the dial pad.



If you must wait for another dial tone or signal at any point in the dialing sequence, create a pause in the number by pressing **Redial/Pause**. Each key press adds a 3.5-second delay.

Advanced Fax Operation (Black & White only)

You can *only* use one advanced fax operation at a time:

- Fax Forwarding
- Paging
- Fax Storage
- Fax Preview
- PC Fax Receive
- Off

You can change your selection at any time. If received faxes are still in the machine's memory when you change the advanced fax operations, an LCD question will appear. (See *Changing Advanced Fax Operation* on page 59.)

Fax Operations

Fax Forwarding

When you choose Fax Forward, your machine stores the received fax in the memory. The machine will then dial the fax number you have programmed and forward the fax message.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Advanced Fax Operation.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Fwd/Page/Store.

- 6 Enter the forwarding number (up to 20 digits).
 Press **OK**.
- 7 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Backup Print:On or
 Backup Print:Off.
 Press OK.



- If you choose Backup Print:On, the machine will also print the fax at your machine so you will have a copy. This is the safety feature in case there is a power failure before the fax is forwarded or a problem at the receiving machine. The machine can store faxes approximately 24 hours if there is a power failure.
- When Fax Forwarding is turned on your machine will only receive black & white faxes into memory. Color faxes will not be received, unless the sending machine converts them to black & white before sending.
- 8 Press Stop/Exit.

Paging

When you choose Paging, your machine dials the pager number you have programmed, and then dials your PIN (Personal identification Number). This activates your pager so you will know that you have a fax message in the memory.

If you have set Paging, a backup copy of the received fax will automatically be printed at the machine.

- 1 Press Menu.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press OK.

- You cannot change a paging number or PIN remotely.
- If Paging is turned on your machine cannot receive a color fax unless the sending machine converts it to black & white.

Fax Storage

If you choose Fax Storage, your machine stores the received fax in the memory. You will be able to retrieve fax messages from another location using the remote retrieval commands.

If you have set Fax Storage, a backup copy will automatically be printed at the machine.

- Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press **OK**.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Advanced Fax Operation.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Fwd/Page/Store.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax Storage. Press OK.
- 6 Press Stop/Exit.



If Fax Storage is turned on your machine cannot receive a color fax unless the sending machine converts it to black & white.

Fax Preview

If you choose Fax Preview you can view received faxes on the LCD by pressing the Fax Preview key. When the machine is in Ready mode, a popup message will appear on the LCD to alert you of new faxes. You can continue all operations.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Fax. Press **OK**.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose
 Advanced Fax Operation.
 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose

When Fax Preview is turned on your machine can only print the color faxes it receives. It cannot store them in memory.

How to preview a fax

When you receive the fax, you will see the pop-up message on the LCD. (For example:

New Fax(es):02)

Press Fax Preview.
You can see the new fax list.



You can also see your old fax list by pressing \star . Press # to go back to your new fax list.

Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the fax you want to see.

Press OK



If your fax is large there may be a delay before it is displayed on the LCD.

PC Fax Receive

If you turn on the PC-Fax Receive feature your machine will store received faxes in memory and send them to your PC automatically. You can then use your PC to view and store these faxes.

Even if you have turned off your PC (at night or on the weekend, for example), your machine will receive and store your faxes in its memory. The number of received faxes that are stored in the memory will appear at the bottom left side of the LCD.

When you start your PC and the PC-FAX Receiving software runs, your machine transfers your faxes to your PC automatically.

To transfer the received faxes to your PC you must have the PC-FAX Receiving software running on your PC. (For details, see Chapter 6 in the Software User's Guide on the CD-ROM.)

If you choose Backup Print: On the machine will also print the fax.

10 Polling

Introduction

Even if your machine is not connected to your computer, you can print photos directly from digital camera media. Your Brother machine includes media drives (slots) for use with popular digital camera media:

CompactFlash[®], SmartMedia[®], Memory Stick® Memory Stick Pro™, SecureDigital™, MultiMediaCard™ and xD-Picture Card™.



- miniSD™ can be used with a miniSD™ adapter.
- Memory Stick Duo™ can be used with a Memory Stick Duo™ adapter.
- Memory Stick Pro Duo[™] can be used with a Memory Stick Pro Duo™ adapter.
- Adapters are not included with the machine. Contact a third party supplier for adapters.

The PhotoCapture Center™ feature lets you print digital photos from your digital camera at high resolution to get photo quality printing.

PhotoCapture Center™ needs

To avoid errors, remember the following points:

- The DPOF file on the media card must be in a valid format. (See DPOF printing on page 80.)
- The image file extension must be .JPG (Other image file extensions like .JPEG, .TIF, .GIF and so on will not be recognized).
- Walk-up PhotoCapture Center[™] printing must be performed separately from PhotoCapture Center™ operations using the PC. (Simultaneous operation is not available.)
- IBM Microdrive[™] is not compatible with the machine.
- The machine can read up to 999 files on a media card.
- Use only Smart media cards with a 3.3v voltage rating.
- CompactFlash[®] Type II is not supported.
- xD-Picture Card™ Type M (Large Capacity) is supported.

Please be aware of the following:


■ When printing the INDEX or IMAGE, the PhotoCapture Center™ will print all the valid images, even if one or more images have been corrupted. A portion of the corrupted image may be printed.

Your machine is designed to read media cards that have been formatted by a digital camera.

When a digital camera formats a media card it creates a special folder into which it copies image data. If you need to modify the image data stored on a media card with your PC, we recommend that you do not modify the folder structure created by the digital camera. When saving new or modified image files to the media card we also recommend you use the same folder your digital camera uses. If the data is not saved to the same folder, the machine may not be able to read the file or print the image.







If your digital camera supports DPOF printing, you will be able to choose on the digital camera display the images and number of copies you want to print.

When the memory card (CompactFlash[®], SmartMedia[®], Memory Stick[®], Memory Stick Pro™, SecureDigital™ MultiMediaCard™ and xD-Picture Card™) with DPOF information is put into your machine, you can print the chosen image easily.







Improving print quality

Cleaning the print head

To ensure the good print quality, the machine will regularly clean the print head. You can start the cleaning process manually if needed.

Clean the print head and ink cartridges if you get a horizontal line in the text or graphics on your printed pages. You can clean Black only, three colors at a time

(Cyan/Yellow/Magenta), or all four colors at once.

Cleaning the print head consumes ink. Cleaning too often uses ink unnecessarily.

 The machine begins printing the Print Quality Check Sheet.
- Check the quality of the four color blocks on the sheet.
- 6 The LCD asks you if the print quality is

Do one of the following:

- If all lines are clear and visible, press
 1 (Yes) to finish the Print Quality check.
- If you can see missing short lines as shown below, press 2 to choose No.



- The LCD asks you if the print quality is OK for black and three colors.

 Press 1 (Yes) or 2 (No).
- 8 The LCD asks you if you want to start cleaning.

Press 1 (Yes).

The machine starts cleaning the print head.

9 After cleaning is finished, press Color Start.

The machine starts printing the Print Quality Check Sheet again and then return to step **5**.

If you repeat this procedure at least five times and the print quality is still poor, replace the ink cartridge for the clogged color.

After replacing the ink cartridge, check the print quality. If the problem still exists, repeat the cleaning and test print procedures at least five times for the new ink cartridge. If ink is still missing, call Brother Customer Service (see *Brother numbers* on page i).

CAUTION

DO NOT touch the print head. Touching the print head may cause permanent damage and may void the print head's warranty.

Note



When a print head nozzle is clogged the printed sample looks like this.



After the print head nozzle is cleaned, the horizontal lines are gone.

Checking the printing alignment

You may need to adjust the printing alignment. However, if after transporting the machine your printed text becomes blurred or images become faded then adjustments may need to be made.

- 1 Press Ink.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Test Print. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Alignment. Press OK.
- 4 Press Black Start or Color Start.
 The machine starts printing the
 Alignment Check Sheet.
- 5 Check the 600 dpi and 1200 dpi test prints to see if number 5 most closely matches number 0.
- 6 Do one of the following:
 - If the number 5 sample of both the 600 dpi and 1200 dpi are the best matches, press 1 (Yes) to finish the Alignment Check.
 - If another test print number is a better match for either 600 dpi or 1200 dpi, press 2 (No) to choose it.
- 7 For 600 dpi, press the number of the test print that most closely matches the number 0 sample (1-8).
- 8 For 1200 dpi, press the number of the test print that most closely matches the number 0 sample (1-8).
- 9 Press Stop/Exit.

Checking the ink volume

Although an ink volume icon appears on the LCD, you can use the **Ink** key to see a large graph showing the ink that is left in each cartridge.

- 1 Press Ink.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Ink Volume. Press OK. The LCD shows the ink volume.
- 3 Press Stop/Exit.



You can check the ink volume from your computer. (See *Chapter 1* or *Chapter 8 in the Software User's Guide on the CD-ROM.*)


Packing and shipping the machine

When you transport the machine, use the packing materials that came with your machine. If you do not pack the machine properly, you could void your warranty.

Q CAUTION

It is important to allow the machine to 'park' the print head after a print job. Listen carefully to the machine before unplugging it to make sure that all mechanical noise has stopped. Not allowing the machine to finish this parking process may lead to print problems and possible damage to the print head.

1 Lift the scanner cover from the righthand side of the machine until it locks securely into the open position. 2 Take out all the ink cartridges and install the yellow protective parts. (See Replacing an ink cartridge on page 117.)
When installing the yellow protective parts, make sure they clip into place as








A CAUTION

If you are not able to find the yellow protective parts, DO NOT remove the ink cartridges before shipping. It is essential that the machine be shipped with either the yellow protective parts or the ink cartridges in position. Shipping without them will cause damage to your machine and may void your warranty.

3 Lift the scanner cover to release the lock. Gently push the scanner cover support down and close the scanner cover.




- 4 Unplug the machine from the telephone wall jack and take the telephone line cord out of the machine.
- Unplug the machine from the AC power outlet.
- 6 Unplug the interface cable from the machine, if it is connected.



Cleaning the outside of the machine

CAUTION

Use neutral detergents. Cleaning with volatile liquids such as thinner or benzine will damage the outside surface of the machine.

DO NOT use cleaning materials that contain ammonia.

DO NOT use isopropyl alcohol to remove dirt from the control panel. It may crack the panel.

Clean the outside of the machine as follows:




Replacing an ink cartridge

Your machine is equipped with an ink dot counter. The ink dot counter automatically monitors the level of ink in each of the 4 cartridges. When the machine detects an ink cartridge is running out of ink, the machine will tell you with a message on the LCD.

The LCD will tell you which ink cartridge is low or needs replacing. Be sure to follow the LCD prompts to replace the ink cartridges in the correct order.


Even though the machine tells you that an ink cartridge is empty, there will be a small amount of ink left in the ink cartridge. It is necessary to keep some ink in the ink cartridge to prevent air from drying out and damaging the print head assembly.

- 1 Lift the scanner cover from the righthand side of the machine until it locks securely into the open position. If one or more ink cartridges are empty, for example Black, the LCD shows Ink Empty Black and Replace Ink.
- 2 Pull the ink cartridge hook (1) toward you and take out the ink cartridge for the color shown on the LCD.




3 Open the new ink cartridge bag for the color shown on the LCD, and then take out the ink cartridge.

4 Take out the protective yellow cap (1).



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
DO NOT touch the area shown in the illustration below.

If the protective yellow caps come off when you open the bag, the cartridge will not be damaged.

5 Each color has its own correct position. Keep the ink cartridge in an upright position when you put it into the slot. Press down on the ink cartridge until the hook (1) snaps over it.

 If you wait until the LCD shows

If the LCD shows Install after you install the ink cartridges, check that the ink cartridges are installed properly.



WARNING

If ink gets in your eyes, wash them out with water at once and call a doctor if you are concerned.



CAUTION

DO NOT take out ink cartridges if you do not need to replace them. If you do so, it may reduce the ink quantity and the machine will not know the quantity of ink left in the cartridge.

DO NOT touch the cartridge insertion slots. If you do so, the ink may stain your skin.

If ink stains your skin or clothing, wash with soap or detergent at once.

If you mix the colors by installing an ink cartridge in the wrong position, clean the print head several times after correcting the cartridge installation.

Once you open an ink cartridge, install it in the machine and use it up within six months of installation. Use unopened ink cartridges by the expiration date written on the cartridge package.

DO NOT dismantle or tamper with the ink cartridge, this can cause the ink to leak out of the cartridge.

Brother strongly recommends that you do not refill the ink cartridges provided with your machine. We also strongly recommend that you continue to use only Genuine Brother Brand replacement ink cartridges. Use or attempted use of potentially incompatible ink and/or cartridges in the Brother machine may cause damage to the machine and/or may result in unsatisfactory print quality. Our warranty coverage does not apply to any problem that is caused by the use of unauthorized third party ink and/or cartridges. To protect your investment and obtain premium performance from the Brother machine, we strongly recommend the use of Genuine Brother Supplies.

Memory storage

Even if there is a power failure, you will not lose the settings you have chosen using the Menu key because they are stored permanently. Also, you will not lose your settings in the PhotoCapture, Fax and Copy mode key menus if you have chosen Set New Default. You may have to reset the date and time.





Glossary

This is a comprehensive list of features and terms that appear in Brother manuals. Availability of these features depends on the model you purchased.

ADF (automatic document feeder)

The document can be placed in the ADF and scanned one page at a time automatically.

Auto Reduction

Reduces the size of incoming faxes.

Automatic Redial

A feature that enables your machine to redial the last fax number after five minutes if the fax did not go through because the line was busy.

Backup Print

Your machine prints a copy of every fax that is received and stored in memory. This is a safety feature so you will not lose messages during a power failure.

Batch Transmission

(Black and white faxes only) As a cost saving feature, all delayed faxes to the same fax number can be sent as one transmission.

Beeper Volume

Volume setting for the beep when you press a key or make an error.

Brightness

Changing the Brightness makes the whole image lighter or darker.

Broadcasting

The ability to send the same fax message to more than one location.

Caller ID

A service purchased from the telephone company that lets you see the number (or name) of the party calling you.

Cancel Job

Cancels a programmed job, like Delayed Fax or Polling.

CNG tones

The special tones (beeps) sent by fax machines during automatic transmission to tell the receiving machine that a fax machine is calling.

Coding method

Method of coding the information contained in the document. All fax machines must use a minimum standard of Modified Huffman (MH). Your machine is capable of greater compression methods, Modified Read (MR), Modified Modified Read (MMR) and JPEG, if the receiving machine has the same capability.

Communication error (Comm. Error)

An error during fax sending or receiving, usually caused by line noise or static.

Compatibility group

The ability of one fax unit to communicate with another. Compatibility is assured between ITU-T Groups.

Contrast

Setting to compensate for dark or light documents, by making faxes or copies of dark documents lighter and light documents darker.

Delayed Fax

Sends your fax at a specified time later.

Distinctive Ring

A subscriber service purchased from the telephone company that gives you another phone number on an existing phone line. The Brother machine uses the new number to simulate a dedicated fax line.

Dual Access

Your machine can scan outgoing faxes or scheduled jobs into memory at the same time it is sending a fax from memory or receiving or printing an incoming fax.

Easy Receive

Enables your machine to respond to CNG tones if you interrupt a fax call by answering it.

ECM (Error Correction Mode)

Detects errors during fax transmission and resends the pages of the fax that had an error.

Extension phone

A telephone using the same line as your fax but plugged into a separate wall jack.

External phone

A telephone that is plugged into the EXT jack of your machine.

F/T Ring Time

The length of time that the Brother machine rings (when the Receive Mode setting is Fax/Tel) to notify you to pick up a voice call that it answered.

Fax Forwarding

Sends a fax received into the memory to another pre-programmed fax number.

Fax Receive Code

Press this code (*\times 5 1) when you answer a fax call on an extension or external phone.

Fax Storage

You can store received faxes in memory.

Fax tones

The signals sent by sending and receiving fax machines while communicating information.

Fax/Tel

You can receive faxes and telephone calls. Do not use this mode if you are using a telephone answering device (TAD).

Fine resolution

Resolution is 203×196 dpi. It is used for small print and graphs.

Gray scale

The shades of gray available for copying and faxing photographs.

Group number

A combination of Speed-Dial numbers that are stored in a Speed-Dial location for Broadcasting.

Help list

A printout of the complete Menu table that you can use to program your machine when you do not have the User's Guide with you.

Fax Journal

Lists information about the last 200 incoming and outgoing faxes. TX means Transmit. RX means Receive.

Journal Period

The pre-programmed time period between automatically printed Fax Journal Reports. You can print the Fax Journal on demand without interrupting the cycle.

LCD (liquid crystal display)

The display screen on the machine that shows interactive messages during On-Screen Programming and shows the date and time when the machine is idle.

Manual fax

When you lift the handset of your external telephone or press **Hook** you can hear the receiving fax machine answer before you press **Black Start** or **Color Start** to begin sending.

Menu mode

Programming mode for changing your machine's settings.

OCR (optical character recognition)

Ring Delay

The number of rings before the machine answers in Fax Only and Fax/Tel mode.

Volume setting for the machine's ring.
